MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Requirements are mandated by statute 52 O.S. § 149(8) (1999 Supplement): "Shall have four (4) years practical and three (3) years regulatory experience in the production of oil and gas..."

SPECIAL REQUIREMENT: Applicants must be willing and able to perform all job-related travel normally associated with this position.

NOTE: Selected applicant must live in the assigned District. If the current residence does not meet this requirement, selected applicant will be required to relocate within 30 days of the offer of employment.

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Perform and supervise investigations in response to complaints of rule violations and environmental pollution to determine sources and identify possible causes.
- Perform and supervise inspections of drilling, transportation and production facilities in order to determine compliance with Commission rules pertaining to environmental protection and waste management.
- Respond to and investigate threats to public safety resulting from well blowouts and other hazards.
- Oversee environmental remediation efforts and perform follow up inspections to ensure compliance with guidelines and instructions.
- Witness tests and record data on well production potential, gas/oil ratios, bottom hole pressure, mechanical integrity, fluid levels or other tests required to ensure compliance.
- Research the history of specific abandoned wells to determine responsibility for plugging; may determine priority and placement on state funded plugging list.
- Provide testimony in Commission hearings regarding findings of investigations and actions taken.
